- *Permittee understands that this permit is issued for the sole purpose of compliance with Boundary County Road Standards Ordinance No. 2020-2, Section 3:3.1 through 3.5 "Approach Permits and Standards.*
- *Permittee further understands that this permit in no way relieves their obligation to comply with the applicable laws of the State of Idaho related to access construction, including sediment and erosion control.*
- Permittee must notify Boundary County Road & Bridge one week prior to construction.
- Permittee must notify Boundary County Road & Bridge IMMEDIATELY upon completion of the construction for Post-Inspection.
- Permittee is responsible for obtaining all utility locates prior to any excavation per Idaho Code Title 55, Chapter 22.
- Permittee is responsible to ensure all traffic control and signage conforms to the latest standards set in the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices during construction.
- It is the responsibility of the Permittee to provide any easement documentation involved in this approach to the Boundary County Planning and Zoning Administrator for recognition of approach location.
- This permit covers operations in the county right of way only, and the Permittee is responsible for any of Permittee's actions off the right of way to adjoining property owners.
- Boundary County will in no way be held responsible for any errors, omissions or interpretation as to county right of way or easements.
